Funding

FUNDING ASSISTANCE

Funding assistance may be available for individuals who meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Age 15 or older and have completed or left secondary school (including home schooling)
- · Permanent residency in Queensland
- Australian citizenship, Australian permanent residency (including humanitarian entrant), temporary residency with the
 necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or New Zealand citizenship
- · Not currently enrolled in training, including Vocational Education and Training (VET) and higher education courses

SKILLING QUEENSLANDERS FOR WORK (SQW) FULLY FUNDED PROGRAMS

SQW offers fully funded programs, such as Get Set for Work and Community Work Skills, covering all course costs, including uniforms, for eligible students. Second chance funding is available for individuals holding a Certificate III or higher. You do not need to be in receipt of Centrelink payments to access this funding. Please contact us for more details regarding SQW eligibility.

CERTIFICATE 3 GUARANTEE -SUBSIDISED FUNDED PROGRAM

The Certificate 3 Guarantee program provides subsidised training places to Queenslanders, enabling them to obtain their first Certificate III qualification in priority training areas. Accessing this government funding may affect your eligibility for further subsidised training in the future. To be eligible, you must not hold or be enrolled in a Certificate III or higher qualification.

- Students will also need to purchase a uniform, which costs approximately \$30 to \$40.

OTHER STUDENTS

If you are ineligible for the above-mentioned funding options, please speak to us about external funding assistance that may be available. The full course cost is \$3150, and a payment plan may be negotiated for those paying the full amount. Students will also need to purchase a uniform.

Entry requirements

Students require suitable LLN level to complete the course. Students will require suitable technology to access the course and submit assessments. Students must wear suitable attire during the course e.g. non-slip shoes, hair tied back and or hair/beard nets as required. Students must also possess, or be willing to obtain a USI (Unique Student Identifier)
